## Your results

As more diverse profiles become available, re-norming will take place. Such re-norming exercises may affect your scores, but are unlikely to have a significant impact.

Please note that you may score equally high / low on seemingly opposite subdimensions of the same category. For example, you may achieve high scores on both "Follows rules" as well as "Breaks rules". This can be understood in terms of the complexity of psychological functioning; behavioural adaptability and therefore the possibility that you may apply yourself differently in various contexts.

Breaks rules	The degree to which you are willing to break common rules, possibly take shortcuts, not be bound by regulations. #### Safety orientation

Cautious	The degree to which your behaviour reflects security needs, such as possible fears or anxieties, distrusts and doubts, the prevention of personal, health and financial risks, and the careful avoidance of threats.	1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10

#### Achievement orientation

Construct	Definition	Score
Competitive	The degree to which you pursue ambitious goals in an energetic, diligent and focused manner. High scores also indicate commitment, enthusiasm and a willingness to adapt and learn where necessary.	1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10

#### **Emotional orientation**
